In INNOVIS PHARMA (hereinafter referred to as the “Company” or “we”) we try to meet the needs of the visitors of the website [www. innovishealth.gr](http://www.innovishealth.gr) (the “Website”) by using responsibly the information collected through the Website. We are committed to respect your privacy and comply with applicable laws on data protection and privacy.

Processing of your personal data is governed by these terms, by the relevant provisions of Greek and EU legal framework on data protection, including the General Data Protection Regulation (2016/679) and the relevant decisions, guidelines and regulations issued by the Hellenic Data Protection Authority.

This Personal Data Policy (the "Policy") forms an integral part of our Website and may be subject to modifications. We advise you to regularly check our Personal Data Policy to remain informed and updated on any amendments. By visiting and navigating through our Website you agree to this Personal Data Policy and to the Cookie Policy as in force at the time. When substantial amendments are made, we will ensure that a relevant notice is posted for the visitors of our Website.

This Policy explains how we collect, process and/or use information that we receive via our website and the emails we send that link to this Policy, as amended from time to time. This Policy also describes how we collect, process, use and share the personal information you provide us with. It also describes your choices regarding use, access, transfer, correction and deletion of your personal information.

1. Information we collect

We collect information about you to provide our services. In order to provide our services to you in the best possible manner and to fulfil our contractual obligations, it is essential for us to be able to collect and use the data described in this Policy.

1.1 Information we collect

i. Communication

When you submit your data in our contact form, we collect and retain your data exclusively for the purposes mentioned below. In this context, we collect data that you chose to provide to us, such as you name, surname, email, and telephone number.

iii. Pharmacovigilance Service

When you submit requests to Pharmacovigilance Service, we collect and retain the data required by sector specific legislation, as well as any other data you chose to disclose. In particular, when disclosed, we will collect and process, the following data, indicatively:

- The name and surname of the individual requesting information or reporting adverse events;
- Contact details of the individual requesting information or reporting adverse events (telephone number, email)
- Any data that you voluntarily disclose in your message

1.2 Information We Collect Automatically

When you use the Website, your device is automatically providing information to us, so we can respond and customize our response to you. The type of information we collect by automated means generally includes technical information about your computer, such as your IP address or other device identifier, the type of device you use, and operating system version. The information we collect may also include usage information and statistics about your interaction with the Website. That information may include the URLs of our web pages that you visited, URLs of referring and exiting pages, page views, time spent on a page, number of clicks, platform type, location data (if you have enabled access to your location on your mobile device), and other information about how you used the platform.

This information is collected by using Cookies & other similar Tracking Technologies. We strongly advise you to review our Cookies Policy below.

2. Why we collect your information

We process your data exclusively for the below purposes:

<i>Purpose</i>	<i>Explanation</i>
Communication	When you submit your data in our contact form, we will use them to communicate with you and provide the information and/or services required. Processing of your data is necessary to perform the requested service.

Pharmacovigilance Service	We process your data for reasons of public interest in the field of public health and, in particular, to ensure high standards of quality and safety of medicines or medical devices or other formulations. Data collected are transmitted to the competent authorities in anonymous format. When we collect data on behalf of the marketing authorization holders, we normally transmit to them anonymous data, unless transmission of data including your name and surname is required for following-up or based on our contract with the marketing authorization holder.
Improvement of services	We maintain your data and the history of use of our services to produce statistics that allow us to better assess how visitors interact with our Website and to improve its content and structure. The processing of data is based on the legitimate interest of the company in monitoring visitors' response to its services and improving its services.
Legal Obligations & Claims	When a legal obligation is in place, we will provide your data to the competent authorities. We will maintain and process your data to the extent necessary to establish, exercise or support legal claims
Newsletters and marketing material	If you provide your consent by registering your data in the field for subscription to our Newsletter, we will register your data and send you Newsletters and updates on our services and events.

3. Recipients of your data

Access to your data may only be provided to our duly authorised employees or business partners who act on our behalf for the above purposes of processing, by offering us IT services for the registration and storage of your data and/or for the operation of our website and/or pharmacovigilance services. Data collected by Pharmacovigilance are transferred to the marketing authorization holder and the competent authorities when required based on law or regulation and/or contract. When necessary for the purposes of the specific processing, your data will be transferred to affiliate companies of Innovis Pharma. Your data are not transferred to countries outside the European Economic Area (EEA), to third countries and international organisations.

4. Duration of processing

Retention periods can vary significantly based on the type of information and how it is used. Our retention periods are based on criteria that include legally mandated retention periods, pending or potential litigation, our intellectual property or ownership rights, contract requirements, operational directives or needs, and historical archiving.

We will retain your data for the period required to respond to your contact request and for one (1) year after completing processing and archiving your request. Data collected are kept in digital format and with safety at Company's premises.

Data collected for pharmacovigilance purposes are retained for as long as the product's authorization is in force and for 10 years afterwards. When we collect data on behalf of the marketing authorization holder, we will retain your data for the duration of our agreement with the marketing authorization holder. Upon termination of our agreement, we will transfer your data to the marketing authorization holder and delete it from our records. Data collected are kept in hard copies and in digital format and with safety at Company's premises or at the premises of third parties that offer pharmacovigilance services to the Company.

5. Your rights

Our company ensures your rights with respect to processing of personal data and ensures that you may exercise them.

You have the right to request:

8.1 Access to your personal data and information on which data do we process, the purposes of processing, the recipients and the duration of processing.

8.2 Rectification of your personal data if it is inaccurate or incomplete.

8.3 Deletion of your personal data, unless their processing is necessary for the exercise of the legal rights of the Company or of third parties, for the fulfillment of a legal obligation, for public interest reasons or for defending our legal rights before judicial or other Authorities.

8.4 Restriction of processing of your personal data only for specific purposes.

8.5 Ask for the portability of your data, that is to receive the data you have provided in a structured, commonly used format, or ask to send it to a third party designated by you.

8.5 To object to the processing and to withdraw at any time your consent to the processing of your personal data, when processing is based on consent.

This Cookie Policy provides information in respect to the use of Cookies and Similar Technologies by the Website. We will also describe what options you may have regarding Cookies & Similar Technologies.

What are cookies

Cookies are small text files —usually consisting of letters and numbers—stored on your device by a website server.

Cookies are distinguished in “**Session Cookies**” and “**Persistent Cookies**” depending on the time they remain stored on your device. “Session cookies” are stored on your device at the time you visit a website and are deleted automatically after you close your browser. “Persistent cookies” are stored on your device at the time you visit a website and remain stored after you close your browser. Persistent cookies will be activated again automatically when you open your browser and browse the internet.

First and third party cookies – Whether a cookie is “first” or “third” party refers to the website or domain placing the cookie. First party cookies in basic terms are cookies set by a website visited by the user – the website displayed in the URL window. Third party cookies are cookies that are set by a domain other than the one being visited by the user. If a user visits a website and a separate company sets a cookie through that website this would be a third party cookie.

Why do we use cookies?

This Website uses only performance cookies.

Performance Cookies

These cookies collect information on how users use the Website, in order to enable us to update and improve our Website and visitor experience. These cookies do not collect information that identifies a visitor. Such cookies collect information, in respect of:

- pages that users visit more often;

- products and services which are of more interest;
- links that users have followed;
- error messages that users may receive while browsing the Website, etc.

What are similar technologies?

Pixel tags, web beacons, embedded script and clear GIFs (graphics interchange format) are tiny files used to monitor navigation on a website and may be used with cookies. Flash objects (local shared objects) are small files stored on your device by a website using Adobe's Flash player technology.

Web beacons and embedded scripts
